About our Speaker

He has been employed by the M. W. Grand Lodge of Massachusetts as the librarian for the Samuel Crocker Lawrence Library since the fall of 2014, and is the Grand Historian of that Grand Lodge since 2012.

Right Worshipful Brother Hunt was educated in the public schools of Andover, Massachusetts, and attended Bowdoin College in Brunswick Maine, graduating with a cum laude award in history in 1981. During the 1979-1980 academic year he was a student abroad with the Wayne State University Junior Year in Munich program; his future wife, Lisa, was a student abroad the same year.

After graduation, he worked in high tech as a programmer and technical writer; in 2001 his first novel *The Dark Wing*, was published, and he became a full-time writer. His published work includes seven novels and five short stories, as well as numerous articles in Massachusetts' Masonic quarterly magazine, - *Trowel*.

He received his Blue Lodge degrees in Norumbega & Brookline Lodge of Newtonville, Massachusetts, in 1988, and was Master of that lodge between 1993-1995. He affiliated with Mount Hollis Lodge of Holliston, Massachusetts, and was Master of that lodge in 1999 and in 2006.

He served as Marshal for the District Deputy Grand Master of the 5th District in 2009-2010, and was appointed as Grand Historian in 2012 by M. W. Richard J. Stewart, only the second Brother to hold that office, and the first in a century.
